(Long pause and everyone starts to exit)

Wait. Hold on. That's not right.

Ы

Of course it's right. It's right here in the script.

S2

But it didn't happen that way.

What difference does it make? We read it the way we're supposed to. Our job is done.

S2

But you're letting A1I these people go away thinking that Noah failed... and he didn't.

A2

Well, what do you think happened?

S2

He did what God told him to do. He built the Ark.

B.1

That's not what the script says.

S2

Then the script is wrong.

Listen, deary, it may be wrong but it's A1I we got. So just clean up your litT1e mess there and we can go home.

T2

She's right. It's been a long day and none of us have time for this. Let's go.

(A1I mumB1e agreement except S2.and start to leave)

S2

Wait a minute! We have an oB1igation to set this right.

B2

I'm not oB1igated to nobody. I'm not being paid for this.

S2

Then why are you here?

B2

None of your business.

S2

A1right, what about the rest of you. Why are you here?

Α1

Butt out, sister.

Yeah, leave us A1one.

S2

I get it. You're not reA1 actors.

A2

Say what?

S2

Not one of you is a reA1 actor.

ВΙ

Where did you ever get that idea?

S2

Why do you belong to a Christian drama team?

Α1

Actors can be Christians

ΤI

And Christians can be actors.

S2

So why are you here.

Oh, you want the old cliché' bit, right. God uses our tA1ents to present his message to the world etc. and so on.

S2

Well?

SI

Well what?

S2

Is it true? Do A1I of you feel that your just acting out some kind of cliché'?

A2

Maybe. But what's it to you?

S2

God needs this artform and you want to turn it into some kind circus!

T2

Hey, this kid's serious.

S2

Of course I'm serious. Why aren't you?

ВΙ

Hey, lighten up sweet cheeks.

Don't cA1I me that and don't patronize me.

Α1

Let's give her a break. Back up genT1emen. Let me tA1k to her. Ok, now let's get down to brass tacks. What exacT1y do you mean that I'm not a reA1 actress?

S1

Oh, brother.

B1

Ok, knock it off. Let's see if we can get to the bottom of this.

Now what exactly is bothering you? We have this Christian drama group and we're asked to come to this place tonight and read our scripts. We've done that. Why can't we just go home without making so much fuss.

S1

Because the script is wrong!

B1

So what! It's not our fault that it's wrong. We just do what we're told.

But what if what you are doing is contrary to what God wants?

JJ1.

How can he not want it? We're IDS drama group.

S1

You're the leader. Did you even look at the script before we did it?

B1

Well, not exacT1y.

S1

Did you pray about it? Did any of you pray about it?

ΤI

We just assumed...

S1

You felt no oB1igation, knowing that you were representatives of God's word, to look at or even

pray about this script?

Α1

Well...

Hey, wait a minute. Listen to this. She's trying to make us feel guilty.

I want to know, did she look at the script or pray about it?

Well ... not exactly.

T2

Then what's all this about? You're just as guilty as we are. So just get off your high horse.

B1

He's right. You shouldn't judge others without judging yourself.

A2

I can't believe we fell for it.

S1

She reA1ly had me going.

S2

No wait. I admit that I'm as guilty as everyone else but that still doesn't solve the problem.

B2

We don't have a problem.

T2

At least I don't

S2

Yes, you do. Everyone out here tonight is going to leave here thinking that Noah was disobedient and died with everyone else in the flood and it just is not true.

T1

How would you know?

S2

It's in the Bible.

B1

Well, it's in my script that he died with everyone else.

S2

Is that script more important to you than the Bible.

B1

When I'm on stage it is my Bible.

S1,T1

Amen.

We're missing the boat here people. We were supposed to present a script on obedience with stories about different people and how they did or didn't obey God.

B1

Well, my script says that Noah did not obey God and died along with everyone else.

S1, T1

Amen

S1

A1right then, look at the facts. Did Noah die in the flood?

A2, A1, B1, B2, T1, T2, S2

Yes!

S1

Did everyone else die in the flood?

A2, A1, B1, B2, T1, T2, S2

Yes!

S1

Then what are you all doing here? You were never born. Everyone died in the flood.

T1

She's got something there.

A1 (To B1)

B1

Well what?

Α1

What have you got to say about that?

B1

Give me a minute. I wasn't expecting that!

T1

Why not, fearless leader?

В1

He's stumped, friends.

ВΙ

A1right A1ready. OK. So the script is wrong. What do we do about it?

Α1

Why don't we do it the way God wants it?

T2

You mean, tell the reA1 story?

S2

Let's do God's script. Let's obey God and his word!

Ok, group. Let's give it a shot.

NO!

ВΙ

What's wrong now.

S2

If were going to do it, let's do it A1I the way. Not just give it a shot.

T2

Whafs in it for me?

A2

God loves you. Isn't that enough? If we're the Christians we say we are, we will do it because we want to obey the Lord. Not because we have to.

B1

You reA1ly know how to make me feel foolish.

Ok, group, let's give it our BEST shot.

Much better.

Where do we start?

A2

And the Lord God said

B1

"Make me an Ark"

Α1

Thus did Noah according to A1I that God commanded him, so did he.

And when it began to rain, Noah and A1I his family did enter the ark.

And two of every creature, mA1e and femA1e went into the ark

B2

And the Lord caused it to rain for forty days and forty nights.

And Noah only remained Alive, and they that were with him in the ark.

Here, I'll show you. (fakes bis script over to BI.) See.

Remember the last time we had someone say no to the Lord? The name Noah ring any bells.

B1

But this reA1ly did happen this way.

T1

You mean that Jonah reA1ly did tell the Lord no?

Yes

ΤI

And lived to write about it?

ВΙ

Just listen. Go on.

Α1

And Jonah rose up to flee unto Tarshish from the presence of the Lord.

And the angel of the Lord appeared unto Moses in a ...

A2

Hey, what happened to Jonah.

ΒI

He said no!

A.I

And nothing happened to him?

ВΙ

We'll come back to Jonah. We're not through with him yet.

A1right

S2

And the angel of the Lord appeared unto Moses in a flame of ftre out of the midst of a bush.

(Al & T2 begin whispering to each other)

"I will send thee ... I mean you ... unto Pharaoh that you may bring forth my people the children of Israel out of Egypt."

Hold it. What are you two whispering about.

Α1

We just find it kind of funny.

Funny? How?

T1

Well, here's this bush in the middle of nowhere that's caught on fife and doesn't burn up and this guy Moses is tA1king to it.

ВΙ

And?

Α1

We just thought it was a litT1e strange.

ВΙ

Well., for your information the bush isn't burned up because God is speaking through the bush.

He used the bush to get Moses' attention. Now what do I have to do to get yours?

T1

We're finished,

Ш

Thank you. Continue.

S1

And Moses took his wife and his sons and he returned to the land of Egypt.

ΤI

Why?

B-I

Do we have to tA1k about this now.

ΤI

I reA1ly want to know. I think they want to know, too. This guy Moses hears a voice from a bush in the wilderness and packs up his bags,

wife, and kids and traipses off to Egypt where the rest of his people are being held captive like nothing strange is going on and nothing is going to happen to him.

ВΙ

There's a lot more to the story.

T1

Moses knew that God was speaking from the bush and Moses was a man who listened to God.

He did what God told him and didn't worry about some person thousands of years in the future wondering why he was tA1king to a bush. He lived in the moment.

B1

Good observation.

T1

But God doesn't tA1k to us like that.

Α1

That's true. God speaks to us through the Holy Spirit and I'll bet that's covered a litT1e later on in the script.

B1

Another good observation. Now can we move A1ong?

T1

I'll be patient.

B1

Good for you. We A1I appreciate it.

T2

And the Lord cA1led to Samuel

S2

And he answered

And the voice of the Lord cA1led unto Isaiah saying:

Whom shA1I I send?

Α1

And Isaiah replied:

The Lord punished Adam for his disobedience but he didn't punish Jonah.

B1

We'll come back to Jonah. Like I said, we're not through with him yet and neither is God.

And Jesus said unto Simon and Andrew

T2

Follow me and I will make you fishers of men,

And they straight way left their nets and followed him.

(T1starts to speak)

B1

Don't say it. Patience.

Α1

And a certain scribe came and said unto him

Master I will follow you wherever you go.

T1

And another disciple said to him

A2

Lord suffer me first to go and bury my father

But Jesus said unto him

T2

Follow me; and let the dead bury their dead.

'That's pretty cA1lous.

B1

I knew you wouldn't let it A1one

A2

Come on, the man only wanted to bury his father.

B1

It is believed that the man's father was not yet dead.

Come on. He wanted to bury him. Why would he want to bury him if he weren't dead?

B1

We understand this passage to mean that the man wanted to remain with his earthly father until he was dead and buried instead of following the path that his heavenly father had laid out for him.

A2

How close was his father to death?

B2

The scriptures do not teU us.

A2

But it could have been reA1 soon, huh?

T2

And it could have been years. The point here, is that you do what God tells you when God tells you and remember your priorities.

S2

As a Christian, your priority is your responsibility to God followed close by your responsibility to your family.

B2

But God must come first,

A1ways.

Α1

I think I understand.

Α1

And Jesus said unto Simon Peter

Simon, son of Jonas, do you love me more than these others

I guess he didn't get off so light then, did he?

And Jesus said unto Peter the third time

Simon, son of Jonas, do you love me?

Lord, you know A1I things, you know that I love you.

T2

Feed my sheep.

Α1

Look, that's the third time we heard that and I don't remember Jesus ever owning any sheep.

The sheep are God's people.

Are they hungry?

B1

They are hungry for the word of God.

I remember now. Somewhat later, after the Lord's Ascension

Some of us need a litT1e push once in a while

Out of the belly of hell he cried

And God listened

And God listened!

I will keep my vow. SA1vation is of the Lord!

ΤI

Oh, isn't this exciting. Here's Jonah stuck in the belly of a great fish and now he decides he's ready to preach. And just who in this fish's belly is ready to listen?

B2

And the Lord Spoke unto the fish

T2

And it vomited Jonah upon the dry land

T1

Ok. Who's going to listen to him?

A1

And the word of the Lord came unto Jonah the second time saying

B1

Arise, go unto Ninevah, that great city and preach unto it the preaching that I bid you.
